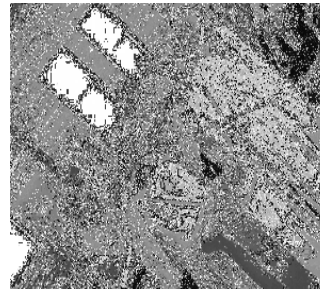

A Taste of Fortune Lake

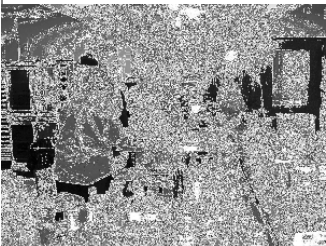

Annual Meeting Minutes

Annual Meeting Minutes - March 22, 2009

1) Call to Order

The annual meeting of the Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp Association was called to order at 4:25 p.m. March 22, 2009, by Pastor Bill Jacobson, board president. The meeting followed a worship service during which Pastor Cori Johnson was installed as Director of Development and Public Relations.

2) Approval of Agenda

Pastor John Shallow requested that eight additional resolutions be added to the agenda. Four of the resolutions were ruled as unnecessary; Pr. Shallow appealed the ruling of chair on three of the resolutions; subsequent votes by paper ballots supported the chair so were not added to the agenda. The remaining four resolutions, later discussed as resolutions #3, #5, #6, #7, were added to the agenda by voice vote. Another resolution presented from the floor (#10) was also added by voice vote. The amended agenda was approved.

3) Determination of Quorum and Appointment of Tellers

Resolution #10 which would give all rostered leaders and retired pastors voting privileges at this meeting and subsequent annual meetings was discussed prior to the

5) Presentation of Reports

2008 Annual Meeting Minutes – Pr. Shallow lifted up a problem with the specific language in the by-law change passed last year which was omitted from the minutes. The phrase “representatives of the members” will be added as follows: “Section 1. Members. The Members of Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp Corporation shall be representatives of the members of the congregations and Authorized Worshiping Communities of the Northern Great Lakes Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, or their successors.”

The minutes were approved as amended.

Report of Board President – Pr. Bill reviewed the “Vision 2009 and Beyond” highlighting deferred maintenance and upgrading projects, expansion of Hickory-Hemlock for adult lodging, and cash flow problems. The report was accepted with a comment from Pastor Dean Peterson with thanks for presenting the “big picture.”

Report of Executive Director – Pr. Art briefly addressed four components of FLLC: program, care of the facilities, communication through FLAMES maintaining camp/congregation connection but everyone sharing the “story,” and the importance of the giving club. The report was accepted.

The motion to accept all other staff and committee reports as printed in the annual report was seconded and carried.

6) Resolution #1: “Be it resolved that the Board of Directors is authorized to take out a bridge loan utilizing funds as needed up to the amount of \$275,500; and be it further resolved that the real estate assets of FLLC may be utilized as collateral for securing the bridge loan; and be it further resolved that FLLC proceed in a fund-raising campaign to reduce the borrowing needs and repayment of the bridge loan.”



reduce the borrowing needs and repayment of the bridge loan.”

The motion was seconded and carried: 51 yes, 28 no, by paper ballot.

7) 2010 Budget – presented by Pr. Steve Gauger. Motion to accept proposed budget (understanding that some changes will occur with implementation of bridge loan) was seconded and carried by voice vote.

8) Election of Board Members

Five nominees were presented from the nominating committee for the four vacancies: Pr. Peter Anderson, Ann Gonyea, Tony Grayvold, Pr. Paul Mai, Bill Rice. Three others were nominated from the floor: Pr. Mike Laakko, Dick Leklem, Andy Sims. 77 ballots were tallied. The new board members elected were Tony Grayvold, Pr. Paul Mai, Andy Sims, and Pr. Peter Anderson.

9) Recognition for Service

Retiring board members Heidi Beland and Gale Hellier were thanked for their dedication and service to FLLC and presented with certificates of service. Dave Huckstep and Gee Petrusky were thanked in absentio.

10) Other Resolutions

#5: “Be it resolved that the provisions of the Bylaws of FLLC, Acticle II, Section 11 be implemented; be it further resolved that the agendas for all FLLC Board and Executive Committee meetings also be sent to be received at the office of association member congregations three days prior to the date of such meetings; be it further resolved that such agendas and minutes of both Board and Executive Committee be sent to be received at the member congregation offices in such fashion so that the necessary sequencing of deliberations and decisions by both Board and Executive Committee be kept in an order for an easy and informed understanding; be it further resolved that email be allowed as the preferred way to transmit the agendas and minutes of both the Board and Executive Committee.”

Motion was seconded and carried.

#6: “Be it resolved that before each annual meeting there shall be a thirty (30) minute informational forum during which the budget, financial reports, and other money matters will be discussed in preparation for the annual meeting itself.”

Motion was seconded and carried,.

#7: “Be it resolved that as the Executive Director and Director of Development and Public Relations plan appeals to member congregations that a 2% allocation of each congregation’s annual expendable income be discussed for eventual decision by the congregation; be it further resolved that the voting delegates at this annual meeting set this 2% allocation of each member congregation’s annual expendable income to be a goal for association support now and into the near future.”

Motion was seconded and defeated by voice vote.

11) Motion to destroy all ballots – seconded and carried. **12) Adjournment** – at 7 p.m.

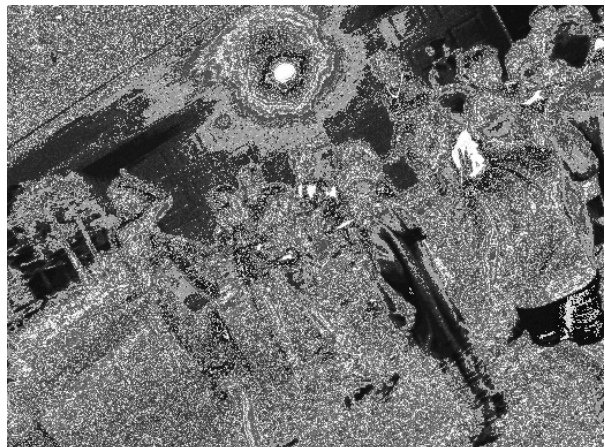

Summer seems so far away in these winter months, but take heart, it's not as far off as you may think! Now is a good time to start thinking about summer plans and looking forward to the warmth that is soon to come. It is also a good time to start thinking about summer camps for your children. Having worked as a counselor at Fortune Lake this past summer and having been a camper there for many years, I have witnessed the importance of Bible camp in the developing faith of children and young adults.

First, camp demonstrates that faith is not a seasonal thing. Summer is a time in which fellowship falls slightly to the wayside. As evidenced by the lower attendance at our church in the summer months; work, vacation, and recreation often take the place of worship. During this time, there is no Sunday school or youth group and kids become busy with other things: playing outside, doing chores, babysitting, and working to earn some cash before the next school year comes around. Camp shows that God is present in summer activity just as much as He is present all other times of the year.

Secondly, camp provides strong Christian role models. Kids are able to see a different kind of college student than the one they see on TV. Often, college is portrayed in movies with all kinds of sex, drugs, and alcohol. A camp counselor demonstrates a college student who is serious about his or her faith and studies, someone who makes friends through compassion and common ground instead of through peer pressure. Counselors also provide campers with someone they can talk to, in whom they can safely question their faith or find emotional support. Sometimes it is easier for a camper to talk with a staff member about what troubles them than it is his or her own parent or pastor. Also, counselors are cool! They're in college, they're upbeat and fun to be around, and many even play the guitar. They show campers new and exciting ways to worship. All in all though, counselors understand many of the issues that their campers face, because they were in the same situations not long ago themselves.

Finally, and maybe most importantly, campers are able to share in important fellowship with Christians who are their own age! At school, faith is suppressed by peer pressure from other kids who view the church as a bunch of "goodie-goodies" and "Bible-thumpers" along with the too common misconception that you are not allowed to talk about the Bible in school. While they may be part of a small youth group, it is often easy to feel alone in their beliefs upon returning to school the next day. Camp gives them a large group of Christians who are the same age and come from many different walks of life. They make many new friends, have all kinds of fun together, and have the opportunity to discuss and grow in their faith together. Besides, kids can be whoever they want at camp! I think that is one reason that camp is so appealing to many kids: they are not tied down by their home reputations. Shy kids can be outgoing and popular kids can be humbled. It is a social environment that is less judgmental than the one they are accustomed to at school. Campers are able to make friends with all kinds of different "cliques" because they all share something in common, something stronger: their struggles in faith as young people.
